

After years of fighting for a commuter ferry service, Red Hook has finally got it and is celebrating in its usual colorful way!

The first NYC Ferry to arrive in Red Hook is due at 6:52 am Thursday, June 1, and PortSide NewYork is planning celebrations! PortSide is laying out a spread with free continental breakfast (while supplies last) from 6:30-8:30am aboard our base of operations, the 79-year old tanker MARY A. WHALEN. A sip of free champagne for a toast and a newspaper for all passengers of the first boat will be provided compliments of the local newspaper, The Red Hook Star Revue. Expect some maritime costume characters in the mix. NYC Ferry is hiring and will be there with information.

PortSide NewYork's President Carolina Salguero says, "I'm so excited. My advocacy for commuter ferry service in Red Hook goes back 14 years, before founding PortSide. The creation of Atlantic Basin in the 1840s, transformed Red Hook; adding a ferry here will have Atlantic Basin transform Red Hook again, reconnecting us to the world. This is Red Hook's ferry sweet spot - close to NYCHA residents who live furthest from the subway, the Brooklyn Cruise Terminal, Van Brunt retail, and attractions such as Pioneer Works and PortSide NewYork. PortSide is poised to be an amenity to waiting passengers who will enjoy the deck of our ship MARY A. WHALEN during TankerTime, and we can do more if we fulfill plans to grow our footprint on site. We thank the EDC for responding to community input in Red Hook and around the harbor about the ferries. Next up! Ferries for Brooklyn to Staten Island, Brooklyn and Staten Island to NJ, and free transfers to the MTA.
